

**The Q & A below contains some of the more frequently asked and important questions regarding voting for the upcoming November 6, 2012 election.**

**Q. When is the presidential election?**

A. *Tuesday, November 6, 2012. The polls are open from 7 AM- 8PM. The election is also referred to as the State Election.*

**Q. When is the last day to register to vote in order to be eligible to vote during the November 6<sup>th</sup>, election?**

A. *The last day to register to vote is Wednesday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. The Town Clerk's office will be open until 8 PM. You may register to vote as long as you will turn eighteen (18) years of age on or prior to November 6<sup>th</sup>.*

**Q. How do I register to vote?**

A. *You may register to vote in person at the Town Clerk's office in town hall or you may download a voter registration form at <http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elepdf/2012-Voter-reg-mail-in.pdf> and mail it in to the Town Clerk's office or drop it off at our office. You may not register on-line but you may download the form from the link above. If you pick up a registration form at another location (including another Town Clerk's office), or a voter registration drive, it may be mailed or dropped off at the Town Clerk's office.*

**Q. Do I need identification to register to vote?**

A. *You do not need to show identification to register to vote. However, the voter is required to provide identification information on the form; either the last four digits of your social security number or your driver's license number. If you do not have that information when you register to vote you will be asked to show identification at the polls the first time that you vote in that location. The identification required at the polls must include the address at which you registered.*

**Q. How do I know if I am registered to vote?**

A. *If you registered recently you will receive a confirmation notice from the Town Clerk's office confirming your registration and indicating your polling location. If you are not sure if you received a confirmation notice or would like to confirm your registration, call the Town Clerk's office at (508) 696 0148.*

**Q. I registered to vote at the Registry of Motor Vehicles but did not receive a confirmation notice from the Town, what should I do?**

A. *If you registered to vote or think that you registered to vote at the Registry of Motor Vehicles, you should receive a confirmation letter as well. These registrations are sent to us electronically through a statewide system. We urge you to call the Town Clerk's office at (508) 696 0148 to confirm your registration if you have not received a confirmation letter. There may be a lag time before the forms from the Registry of Motor Vehicles are received in the Town Clerk's office. **Confirming your voter registration will facilitate voting on November 6<sup>th</sup>.***

**Q. If I move and changed my address at the Post Office does my voter registration transfer to my new community or my new address?**

A. *No. You must re-register to vote in your new community. If you have moved within West Tisbury you must still re-register to vote at your new address.*

**Q. What hours are the polls are open?**

A. *The polls will open at 7 AM in the morning and close at 8 PM in the evening. Anyone in line when the polls close will be able to vote.*

**Q. Where do I vote?**

A. *The Public Safety Building, Station 2, located at 454 State Rd, across from Conroy's Apothecary.*

**Q. What candidates and ballot questions are on the ballot for this election?**

A. *Sample/specimen ballots are posted at Town Hall, and will be posted throughout town prior to the election.*

**Q. Are there any ballot questions this year?**

A. *There are three binding statewide questions and certain non-binding questions depending on where you live. **Q. Do I need to show ID at the polls?**

A. *Massachusetts does not have a voter ID law. The only time that you will be asked for identification is if you are a first time voter and did not provide identification information at the time you registered to vote or if you are an inactive voter. A voter may become inactive when they or the head of household does not return the annual Town census also known as the street listing mailed in January every year. An "inactive" voter will be asked for identification that shows that they live at the address at which they are registered and they will be asked to sign an affirmation of continuous residency. If you want to make sure that you are an active voter you may call our office at (508) 696 0148 and any member of the staff will be able to help you. You may change your voter status from inactive to active by re-registering to vote or completing the annual street listing.*

**Q. Who can vote absentee?**

A. *In Massachusetts, according to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, voters may vote by absentee ballot "if they will be absent from the town on election day, and/or have a physical disability which prevents them from voting at their polling location, and/or cannot vote at the polls due to religious beliefs".*

**Q. How can I get an absentee ballot?**

A. *You may get an application for an absentee ballot in the Town Clerk's office or you may download the application at the following link: <http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/eleifv/howabs.htm> The application must be submitted to the Town Clerk's office no later than 12 PM (Noon) on Monday, November 5, 2012. All absentee ballots must be completed following the instructions which are included when they are mailed out. You may also vote, after completing an absentee ballot application, in the Town Clerk's office during business hours if you find that you will not be able to vote on Election Day for any of the reasons that entitle you to vote absentee. Completed absentee ballots must be received by 8 PM (the time the polls close) on November 6<sup>th</sup>. A completed absentee ballot, appropriately signed and sealed, may be dropped off at the Town Clerk's office but may **NOT** be delivered directly to the polling location.*

**Q. May I request an absentee ballot for my child, spouse or parent?**

A. *Yes, you may fill out the form entitled "Absentee ballot application by a family member". It is available at the Town Clerk's office or at the following link [http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elepdf/absente\\_ballot\\_fam.pdf](http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elepdf/absente_ballot_fam.pdf) You may request an absentee ballot be mailed to a family member but you may not take it with you to give to them. The absentee ballot,*

*when it is returned must be sealed following the instructions which are provided to the voter. This ballot may be mailed or dropped off at the Town Clerk's office.*

**Q. I am a US citizen but live outside the continental United States, how can I vote?**
