

BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING MINUTES, September 20, 2007

PRESENT: Board Members David Merry, Erik Lowe, and Tim Barnett. Agent John Powers and Asst. Hadden Blair. Guest Richard Andre.

WELLS APPROVED: Richard Andre 31-16 (Main House) and Richard Andre 31-16 (Agricultural/barn) both approved pending submittal of subdivision plans and the decommissioning of the existing well nearest the road frontage). Bernadette Ottiano 17-3.8.

POOL PERMITS APPROVED: Christine Elkind 30-2.20 with the following stipulations; Maintain 20' set back from leach field, and a 10' set back from the septic tank. The dig site must be staked, and 48 hours notice given to the BOH before work commences.

LANDFILL/REFUSE DISTRICT: District Board members Merry and Lowe reported that the District did not discuss the returnable/recycling question, but had a long conversation about coupon use, and decided to do extra bookkeeping to keep track of coupon use by town. The BOH thought a single coupon for use at all LDOs made more sense especially to promote a cohesive district. However, the multi-color coupon books have already been printed. Also, the turn away of commercial haulers on Mondays and Wednesdays was discussed. The Board felt that the commercial haulers should be welcomed on those days. Finally, the Board was informed that the Edgartown Transfer station would be closed the day after Thanksgiving, and the Board unanimously disapproved because it is an important "service" day (don't want to lose the tonnage, and because it would relieve some of the crush on Saturday. At issue is the district employees desire to have the day off like Town employees. The Board felt that this differed because it is an "essential service", and that perhaps time-and-a-half could be paid.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: The Agent informed the Board that the Hospital has generously offered to supply a lot of the materials needed for the flu clinic and will provide 250 doses, 4 nurses, and dispose of the medical waste. Volunteer sign up is going well.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: Sweeney 29-40, HGA form, Coliform Town Hall, Floor Drains 6-2,

Bernier's Market Dumpster, Agents' Evaluation, Riggs boat/office with compost Toilet, Erik Lowe informed Board of ZBA appeal.
