

## **BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 15, 2007**

**Present:** David Meery, Tim Barnett, Erik Lowe, Agent John Powers, and Asst. Hadden Blair

**Wells Taken Under Advisement:** Ginger Chavers 30-2.82 (previous agreement with MVC specifies de-nitrification system), Roger Blake 16-69

**Title 5 Inspection Reports Filed:** Geo. Szakacs Tr. 22-4-12, Barbara Adler 10-199.8, Alec Gale 11-85, Albert Wattenberg 29-8, Roger Blake 16-69.

**Landfill/Refuse District:** The Agent reported that the \$5,000 assessment credit has now been used up by 4 months of the new billing regime for transportation and recyclables (at a higher rate than LY). The Agent thinks the budget will be ok, but more money will definitely be spent.

**Emergency Management:** The flu clinic was a great success. 1430 injections given, 500 doses returned to hospital, and 470 left over. Anyone now needing a shot can do so by appointment at the monthly (Howes House) nurse clinics.

**Old/New Business:** Berniers Market continues to have problems sourcing a leak-proof dumpster. Now hopes to have one by Spring. ZBA continued the "rooster" hearing until 11/28 @7:15, the Pool Inspector sent a letter to the Vineyard Tennis Center giving them a grace period to get another certified operator. DEP sent 16-222 a notice of responsibility for an oil spill. BFI 21-11 needs a permit to store roll-offs and containers and are before the planning board now. DEP gave Rogers Pit an extension to 9/30/08 to complete capping, the oil spill at 36-2.1 has been reclassified by DEP as a tier 2 from a tier one. Island Childrens' School 21-14.7 sent an air quality report showing air (spore removal) much improved, with no further remediation necessary.

**Permits:** The Board signed food permit for Slice of Life to do the Artisans' Festival after Thanksgiving. The Board discussed Massage regulations and fee structure because of the response found when initially trying to inspect/license Island Massuses. The Agent informed the Board that the Towns' BOH, at an All Island BOH Agent's meeting, agreed to license facilities and individuals in the resident Town, and to register Out-of-Town workers on the basis of home Town

licensing/inspecting in order to save the individuals from having to pay/be licensed in each separate Town. The Board voted and unanimously set the fees as follows: Town Massage Establishment \$100 (fee to include proprietor's or head masseuse's individual license), Individual Town Resident Massage License \$50, and Out-of-Town Registration Fee \$25.
