#### What we set out to do

#### Objectives of research

- Solicit community input from 55+ Older Adults to directionally inform the Howes House redesign
- Employ a methodology that is inclusive of all age groups 55+, representative of each of the Up Island towns, representative of COA usage, and of gender and employment status
- Include the perspectives of island-wide agencies that serve Older Adults
- Explore "blue-sky" thinking of what a center for Older Adults could be and how to maximize its utility and value for all
- Create recommendations to keep the community voice active in the redesign process

### **How We Made This Happen**

#### **Getting Started**

- ✓ Focus group committee expanded to include tri-town representation and research expertise (provided by Healthy Aging Martha's Vineyard)
- ✓ Methodology was selected and approved by the Howes House Building Committee

#### Recruitment


- ✓ Local media was employed to raise awareness and recruit for groups
- ✓ Committee members networked across three towns to ensure diversity
- ✓ Contacted service providers for agency perspectives


#### Execution

- ✓ Six 90 minute focus groups, (4 in person, 2 virtually) week of Oct. 3, 2022
- ✓ Five focus groups comprised of community members; one focus group for agencies and individuals providing services to seniors
- √ 59 participants in total




## Participants by Age and Town






### Participants by Gender and Year-Round vs Seasonal




#### Year Round vs Seasonal




### **Employment Status, Usage of Howes House**

  - •Provide access to Public Health Nurse

- •Information available in person as well as over phone
  - •Provides opportunity for socialization
  - Offer support groups (e.g., Parkinson's Support Group)

- •Food and fuel assistance distribution
- Assistance in aging journey (Agency perspective)

## Challenges

 Lack of awareness of resources and services •Perception that services are for only the very old or infirm

•Hours of operation limit access

 Perception that it is for West Tisbury residents only – limited outreach to the other up island towns

The Howes House is located in the Town's historic district


Howes House is surrounded by an art gallery, general store, public library, restaurant, church, gas station, Grange, town hall
