Reopening Massachusetts: Baker-Polito Administration Initiates Transition to Step Two of Second Phase of Four-Phase Approach

Consistent with Public Health Data and Trends, Step Two of Phase II of Reopening Massachusetts Set to Begin on June 22

BOSTON – Today, the Baker-Polito Administration announced that Step Two of Phase II of the Commonwealth's four-phase reopening plan, *Reopening Massachusetts*, will begin on Monday, June 22 to allow additional industries to resume operations under sector-specific guidelines.

Businesses and sectors set to begin operating in Step Two of Phase II are subject to compliance with all mandatory safety standards.

On May 18, the Administration released a four-phased plan to reopen the economy based on public health data, spending at least three weeks in each phase. Key public health data, such as new cases and hospitalizations, has been closely monitored and seen a significant decline allowing for Step Two of Phase II to begin on June 22.

The following will be eligible to reopen in Step Two of Phase II on Monday, June 22:

- Indoor table service at restaurants;
- Close-contact personal services, with restrictions;
- Retail dressing rooms, by appointment only;
- Offices, at 50 percent capacity

Before these sectors can resume operations under the guidelines, businesses must meet all safety standards, create a COVID-19 control plan, and complete a self-certification.

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Covid-19 Reopening Proposal

To: West Tisbury Board of Health

For: Limited-use opening for summer 2020 with Covid-19 precautions

FOCUS has cancelled all scheduled summer programming at the Study Center due to coronavirus. Alternatively, FOCUS would like to have a small number of people living on the property being mentored, trained, and helping with long-term planning and maintenance.

This limited program is planned for approximately 6 weeks (July 1 to August 10).

We anticipate the maximum number of people involved to be fewer than 25. There would be up to 10 college-aged students who would have served as our Vineyard Staff this summer. Additionally, there will be a family (2 parents, 4 children) who will mentor and provide oversight for the 10 "staff." There would also be up to 6 additional FOCUS staff leading and supervising the various projects.

We intend to request coronavirus testing of participants prior to arrival.

All who are not already Vineyard residents would be housed on the FOCUS property. We intend to provide them with private rooms and designated personal bathroom space in the various bunkhouses and the cottages. The family would live in a dedicated residence.

Meals would be prepared in the FOCUS kitchen, under the direction of our Head Cook Brenda Cruz, and be eaten outside on the Dining Hall porch. The family would have their own table. The rest would be arranged so as to maintain a 6-foot distance between people.

We have reviewed the self-certification template from [mas.gov/reopenning](https://www.mass.gov/reopenning) and are planning to comply with the required social-distancing practices, hygiene protocols, staffing & operations protocols, and cleaning & disinfecting guidelines.

We expect participants will primarily be on the property, and when off-property will be engaged in activities where safety protocols can be observed.

We have separate residential buildings that can be used to isolate anyone who tests positive for the coronavirus or who is symptomatic. We would then clean and sanitize per CDC guidelines.


