This house is first mentioned in <u>Mistory of Martha's Vineyard</u> by Charles Banks(1): "On the opposite side of the road from the old Cathcart house stands the building known in 1850 as the Traveler's Hone, then kept by William Athearn and in later years called the Tiasquam House".

The records in the Registry of Deeds (3) shows that it was purchased by an Athearn in 1862 from a Silas Nickerson.

The original structure was a two-story cross gable wood frame building with a shallow granite foundation and a side hall entrance. Prior to 1900, another story was added, a two-story porch was added to the south and a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story ell with a bay window and one story kitchen extension was added to the north. The owner at that time, a New Yorker, moved the house back only six feet in order to accommodate a front yard. The basement foundation verifies this move.

Sold to Joseph Howes in 1921 (4) it was then a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story house with additions. The house later passed into the hands of Gladys Jones(5) who gave it to the Town of West Tisbury in 1976. No exterior changes have been recorded since 1900.

A photograph taken between 1890-1898 which hangs in the Howes House lists the names of former inns which were located in this building: The Hotel Red Eye, Seaview Hotel, Traveler's Home, and the Tiasquam House.
