This is Pat from Woodwell Climate Research Center sending along some information.

We have a project with the Martha's Vineyard Commission and Sheriff's Meadow Foundation to resurvey some plots on the Vineyard that were first surveyed in 1999 and 2000 by Glenn Motzkin and David Foster. Two of these plots are in Greenlands Conservation Area. I've attached a photo of a map showing where they are. I can give you access to the Google Earth map showing the plots and their coordinates when I'm back with access to my computer on Wednesday if you'd like.

We would like to visit these places to do some noninvasive measurements: identifying plants, measuring trees, and taking one soil core to 30 cm depth. The study will be used to estimate carbon stocks in vegetation and soil, investigate changes in carbon stocks and biodiversity over time, and supplement 2021 Lidar data to develop management plans for increased biodiversity and carbon storage on the Vineyard.

We can visit both of these plots in a single day and we're doing field work through about mid-September, so we are flexible on when to visit.

If you have any questions, I would be more than happy to answer them and/or put you in touch with the Principal Investigator on the study, Dr. Chris Neill. Thank you for putting it on the agenda for the next board meeting. Please let me know when that is.
