OLD/NEW BUSINESS: Chris Alley, engineer with Schofield, Barbini & Hoehn presented a plot plan for which the applicants are seeking preliminary approval. Chris was joined by Mr. Heikki Soikkeli. The plan detailing additions (a basement addition and a crawl space) to an existing single family dwelling could only be completed if the Board allows a variance in the dwelling to setic tank requirements from the required 10' to 9'. Chris explained that the existing 1500 gallon tank would need to be replaced if the request was not granted due to it being 1 foot closer than required. Tim Barnett, BOH Chair asked if the applicants would consider a new leaching field. The Board did approve the request. Health Agent Johnson informed the Board that representatives from the Island Wide Youth Collaborative (IWYC) met with the island's health agents on the previous week to give a report on their ongoing activities which are in part funded by the towns. IWYC's primary focus is on working with the youth in the schools who either have substance abuse problems or whose parents have been identified as having substance abuse problems. The Board was also informed that the island's health agents also met with Dick Johnson at the health agent's meetings. Dick provided an update on ongoing efforts to combat Ticks here on the island. A portion of the discussion revolved around the possibility of a new tick (Asian long-horned) finding its way to the island, and could add to current concerns not only because of its ability to transmit disease, but because of its ability to reproduce without mating. Health agent Johnson informed the Board that the finance committee has requested to meet with him to discuss the Board of Health on February 7th, and that it is being requested that a Board member attend as well. Health Agent Johnson informed the Board that he will no longer require that administrative assistant Susan Block attend bi-monthly board meetings. Health Agent Johnson feels Susan's time, because it is limited to 12 hours, would be better spent assisting with office duties.
