ANIMAL/BARN REVIEW FORM APPROVED: Propose New Regulations for Livestock Burial- The Board of Health agent proposed a regulation for livestock (bovine, equine) burial. The language of the regulation was adopted from the University of Massachusetts Extension Crops, Dairy, Livestock and Equine Program. The Board expressed support for the regulation, but stated more research was necessary in order to adopt the order.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: Discuss/Propose Regulation for Enhanced Septic Systems for Residences in Proximity to Coastal Ponds- The Board discussed the possibility of adopting new regulations for septic systems. Due to the recent upsurge in nitrogen loading occurring in coastal ponds, more efforts are being put forth in expanding health code to protect sensitive ecological water bodies. The Board expressed support of the regulation. The Health Agent stated he would reach out to other MV Health Agents to draft the new regulations accordingly.

<u>Covid-19 Update:</u> Summarized the number of COVID-19 cases on the island. In the past two weeks, there have been 48 new cases. The Martha's Vineyard Boards of Health have begun discussing easing mask mandates if the two following conditions are met 1.) 3 or less cases a day and 2.) children ages 5-11 will be required to get vaccinated.
