BEACHES/EM/MDPH: Health Agent Johnson informed the Board of a notice from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) alerting all towns of a statewide HIV outbreak. The State has detected an increase in newly diagnosed HIV infections among persons who inject drugs. This information is

important in the event that additional efforts need to be made in the area of prevention involving the Board of Health and any other island agencies involved with substance abuse.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: The Board was informed that Lambert's Cove Inn has inquired as to whether they would be allowed to add additional seating in their restaurant area, a sink and a dish washer. Health Agent Johnson explained that based on information obtained from their files, their seating capacity was capped at a certain number, and that any additional seats would result in Lambert's Cove Inn exceeding their allowed flow under Title 5. Health Agent Johnson added that the additional seating which is reportedly in the form of elevated seating (bar style) could possibly be added if they eliminated some other seats and stayed within the seating numbers that they were previously allowed.

Health Agent Johnson shared with the Board a letter from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) involving a petition from the State's Clean Water Program and the Toxic Actions Center regarding a petition to establish a treatment technique Drinking Water Standard for Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substance (PFAS). MassDEP is initiating the process to develop standards for water maximum contaminant levels (MCL) for the entire class of PFAS and adopt in the interim Vermont's DPH's advisory of 20 parts per trillion (ppt).

The Board of Health members were given a brief update on the renovation plans at the airport in the form of the Environmental Notification Form (ENF) detailing the airport's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). Tim Barnett (Chair) questioned whether renovations would disturb existing contaminated soil and contribute even further to existing problems. Health Agent Johnson provided each Board member with a copy of a letter drafted by Tara Whiting representing the West Tisbury Conservation Commission. The letter in response to the airport's proposed capital improvement plan expressed the Conservation Committee's concerns as they related to current contamination issues (PFAS & Tetrachloroethylene) and the possible effects that the renovation project will have on the quality of future water supplies. Health Agent Johnson communicated to the Board that these were also the concerns of the BOH, and that this letter provided confirmation that these concerns were at least being addressed during this public comment period. Listed also on the agenda was "Water Operator Option" which was not discussed but will be covered in a future meeting.
